

It's so hard to say goodbye to Ferry Church. During our time here, our family has grown so close to so many of you. You have encouraged us. You've walked alongside us. You've tolerated my eccentricities. And you've blessed us with your wisdom and generosity, your grace and kindness.

Ferry is an extraordinarily kind congregation that has passed through a difficult couple of years and landed again on her feet. In the past several years this congregation has taken significant steps forward so that it can continue its mission for Christ in White Lake. I pray that you continue to support the Consistory and Pastor Beth as they continue to lead this church to a deeper realization of its purpose. And I pray above all else that you would all allow God to become more present in your lives through faith, fellowship and deeper spiritual formation.

After a series of conversations this past year about the future of Ferry Church, the Consistory has focused on four key values to guide their decisions for the next several years. 1) Meaningful worship grounded in intergenerational music and a consistent emphasis on the Word of God. 2) Local Mission, meaning that we remain connected to mission partners in our immediate area and that we become personally invested in our community. 3) Hospitality for those outside of our church community when they visit or interact with our church and an openness to those in

our community who need facilities or resources. (Donna Nelson is beginning a hospitality committee this summer and I'm sure she will be looking for collaborators.) 4) A consistent approach to all people, both inside and outside of the church, that honors the Image of God in everyone. With this vision and the goals attached to it, Ferry is poised to grow and develop as a church through this brief period of pastoral transition.

As we leave, Kari and I would appreciate your prayers as we look for employment and coordinate a cross-country move. Pray that we find a new home that was gracious and kind as this home was to us.

In February I promised you all a written update on the Future Fund. To recap: The Future Fund is an endowment of the church, primarily supplied through the generosity of Bern and Karen Bolema, that was originally intended for the purchase of adjacent property. With their passing, the Consistory has the authority and opportunity to use the Future Fund for other purposes with a majority vote of two-thirds of the elders and deacons. For several months we have been taking suggestions from the congregation and considering ways in which the endowment could be used to enhance our current facilities rather than expanding our property. This past month the Consistory voted to use some of the endowment for a handful of projects while investing the remainder of the funds in a long-range investment.

The projects that were approved include:

Sponsoring a church-wide work day (or two) to freshen up the nursery with new paint and new fixtures.

Saying thank you may help boost your mood. Expressing gratitude is not only



for the recipient as research shows that gratitude helps you see the good in your life. This is seen over and over again in the book that we love as apostle Paul writes "give thanks for all things, in all circumstances" (Ephesians 5:20; 1 Thessalonians 5:18), being thankful even in suffering (Romans 5:3-5; James 1:1-4) and to do everything in the name of Jesus out of a spirit of gratefulness (Colossians 3:17). Pastor Raully just introduced us to a Hebrew prayer that is meant to be sung when you wake up in the morning to show gratitude to our Lord our God. In English it says "I offer thanks to You, our God, for You have mercifully restored my soul within me; Your faithfulness is great." Hebrew: "Modeh ani lefaneha meleh hai vekayam, she'he'hezrta bee neshmatee b'hemla, raba emunatecha." So, it doesn't matter how or when you say it, but thank you goes a long way for not only your physical and emotional health, but also your spiritual health!

Even though Raully and Kari will be leaving, we as a church will remain steadfast in our caring for one another as this is the cornerstone of the church community. Also pray for Raully and Kari as they seek God's calling to be closer to family in Montana.
