# **Picking Teams**

I'm sure you remember picking teams for a games in gym class or on the playground. Perhaps even holding your breath to be picked and hoping not to get picked last. Funny how something with no lasting value can create such anxiety and memories. What irony then that when we become adults we so often feel a sense of relief that we don't get picked, or we shy away from being noticed so we never have our names called, so to speak.

I don't mention this to shame anyone, but rather to heighten our resolve to be in prayer for those who do serve and lead among us. We are in process of selecting and electing new elders and deacons for the year ahead. And what they need most from us is our prayers. Prayers for wisdom and discernment. Prayers for courage and strength. Prayers for their families and for use of time. Prayers for personal growth, patience, and endurance. And whether they are serving for the first time or the fifth time they need our prayers for unity and camaraderie as they grow together as elders and deacons serving alongside each other.

As I was reflecting upon the names of those nominated I reflected back on the selection process to replace Judas:

Therefore it is necessary to choose one of the men who have been with us the whole time the Lord Jesus was living among us, beginning from John's baptism to the time when Jesus was taken up from us. For one of these must become a witness with us of his resurrection. So they nominated two men: Joseph called Barsabbas (also known as Justus) and Matthias. Then they prayed, Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which of these two you have chosen to take over this apostolic ministry, which Judas left to go where he belongs. Then they cast lots, and the lot fell to Matthias; so he was added to the eleven apostles. Acts 1:21-26

I've usually been drawn to the request for God to show which

one should serve since God truly knows them. But as I read it this time I was struck by the description of the role to: become a witness of Jesus' resurrection. As you read the rest of the description it is simply about when they began to follow and what the saw. But this phrase is not about what they currently are or currently are doing. It is about who they will become.

I know elders and deacons are different than Apostles. But much more than simply having a focus on whether someone meets the minimum requirements to serve, we should focus also on who they will become by serving. Of course God knows the heart, but let us pray for the whole person, and not only for those we are now selecting, but also for those already serving. That God will continue to help them become elders and deacons who serve with boldness and gladness for all at Ferry, to the honor and glory of the one they serve, Christ Jesus.


